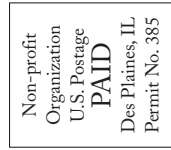

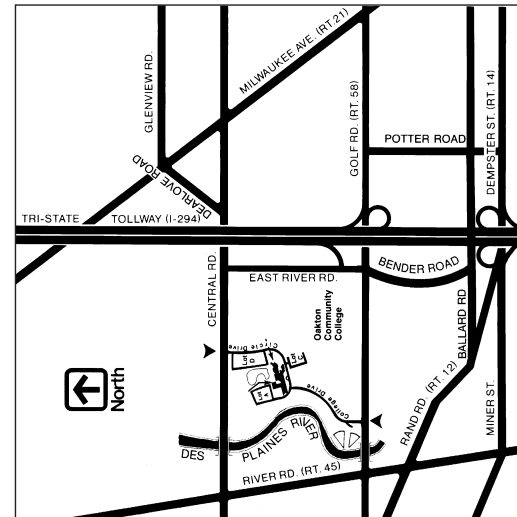
**Cancellation/Refunds:** Course fees are refunded if notification is received at least 48 hours prior to the seminar date. A \$15 fee is charged for all cancellations.

# A Lethal Relationship: Gun Violence and Domestic Violence

**Illinois Representative Jennifer Gong-Gershowitz (D), 17th District**, a first-time representative and life-long social justice advocate, community volunteer, and attorney, Representative Gong-Gershowitz will open the conference discussing the political landscape in Illinois and how it is responding to the public health crisis of gun violence and domestic violence. Having lost her cousin and her cousin's two children to gun violence when they were murdered by their father, Representative Gong-Gershowitz is a leading advocate on common sense gun safety legislation in Illinois to reduce gun violence and save lives.

**April M. Zeoli, Ph.D., MPH**, is an expert on the intersection of intimate partner violence and gun violence, and associate professor in the School of Criminal Justice at Michigan State University. She is on the editorial board of the scholarly journal *Injury Prevention* and serves as the research expert for the National Domestic Violence and Firearms Resource Center.

**David W. Keck, J.D.**, is project director for the National Resource Center on Domestic Violence and Firearms, a project of the Battered Women's Justice Project, and a partner in developing protocol for firearms surrender in domestic abuse injunction cases, which became the framework for Wisconsin's SAFE act, passed in 2014.

## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

In Illinois, as across the country, one in four women will experience domestic violence in her lifetime. When abusers have access to a gun, the lethality of their attacks is magnified exponentially. In the United States, 4.5 million women have had an intimate partner threaten them with a gun and every 16 hours, a woman is fatally shot by her partner. Domestic abuse has been identified as a common thread amongst mass shooting perpetrators. Existing federal and state laws attempt to prohibit some abusers from possessing firearms but implementation and enforcement of the myriad of laws can be a challenge due to loopholes and lack of proper training for law enforcement and court personnel.

## PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

The conference is informative for professionals in the areas of criminal justice, law enforcement, public health and safety, municipal, human service, mental health, education, legislative and advocacy sectors.

Upon completion of this program, participants will be able to:

- Describe nonlethal and lethal uses of guns in domestic violence
- Identify federal and state laws that prohibit domestic violence perpetrators from accessing guns, and loopholes in those laws
- Understand laws related to removal of guns from a scene of domestic violence, restraining order gun restrictions, and data on application and impact among different racial groups
- Examine how a domestic violence perpetrator becomes prohibited from gun purchase and possession
- Explore how domestic violence perpetrators known to the justice system maintain the right to own a gun
- Discuss and review key considerations and steps when implementing the statutory requirement of a firearm surrender/seizure in Illinois
- Understand the important role patrol officers and investigators play in preventing gun violence
