### YWCA Donor Gift Recognition Opportunities

#### **Visionary: \$1,000,000**

<p><b>Community Services Center (Reserved)</b></p>	<p>The first floor of the Family Support Center will offer support and counseling to survivors of domestic violence survivors, and their children, who are still living in abusive situations.</p>
<p><b>Equity Institute (Reserved)</b></p>	<p>The Equity Institute is a pioneering center on the forefront of racial and gender equity work. We will be a convener of community members, organizations and social justice leaders throughout the region.</p>
<p><b>Economic Advancement Center (Reserved)</b></p>	<p>Our new Economic Advancement Center will support over 700 women each year in achieving greater financial stability through financial education and coaching, job training and soft-skills support, and housing access and referrals.</p>

#### **Pacesetter: \$500,000-\$999,999**

<p><b>Aquatics Center \$750,000</b></p>	<p>A place where opportunity meets aspiration and hard work, the Aquatics Center is where up to 2,000 children each year gain leadership skills, perseverance, and self-confidence, along with water safety and swim instruction.</p>
<p><b>Family Apartments in Domestic Violence Family Support Center (4)</b></p>	<p>The Domestic Violence Family Support Center will ensure that women who have been abused, and their children, can get the help they need. Four family apartments will allow larger families to remain together as they heal from abuse. Each apartment can</p>

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<b>\$500,000</b>	house up to 6 people and includes a bathroom. (\$125,000 each)
<b>Children's Center (Reserved)</b>	Addressing the trauma of abuse, and building on the resilience of children, our new Children's Center will include space for play-based therapy and counseling where children are supported as they process their emotions and begin to heal; secure outdoor play areas to enhance physical freedom; and a family meeting room for children to safely connect with relatives during this difficult time of transition.
<b>Financial Education Job Training Lab</b>	Technology-enhanced training and education classroom spaces to enable Economic Advancement clients to learn budgeting and other financial wellness tools, practice job- readiness skills, seek employment, and find affordable housing.
<b>Equity and Empowerment Walkway</b>	A light-filled walkway that connects program and administrative areas and communicates YWCA's message of empowerment and equity.
<b>Boardroom</b>	A comfortable space for YWCA's dedicated board of directors, volunteers, staff and guests to convene.
<b>Visitors Plaza and Parking Area</b>	An outdoor plaza with attractive landscaping, abundant green space, and 40% more parking for the 5,000-plus program participants, volunteers and guests who come through our doors each year.
<b>Main Lobby - South Entrance (Reserved)</b>	The main entrance to all YWCA program areas and the aquatics center which is safe, welcoming and embodies our values of diversity, inclusion and empowerment.

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<b>Emergency Residential Shelter Floors (2)</b>	Emergency housing for women and children who are no longer safe in their own home. Our emergency shelter nurtures and protects survivors - up to 66 women and children a night - offering safety, autonomy, dignity, and privacy.
<b>Play Room (Reserved)</b>	The Play Room will be a safe place in the shelter for children to find peace and support as they heal from the trauma of domestic violence.
<b>Outside Playground (Reserved)</b>	A protected play area where children have the freedom to play and explore while mothers can have peace of mind knowing their children are safe.

## Innovator: \$250,000-\$499,999

<b>Residential Shelter Lounge</b>	The group room enables residents to live and learn as a valued members of our residential community. Residents can meet with counselors for individual or group counseling, attend financial education workshops, learn how to file orders of protection, and develop safety plans.
<b>Kitchen and Dining Room</b>	The heart of the residence, the kitchen and dining room allow healthy cooking, communal eating and a place for building relationships and discovering a sense of safety and community.
<b>Large Swimming Pool</b>	Equitable access to swimming is the guiding principle of our mission-driven swim program. Through swim team and swim classes, YWCA promotes safety and well-being for over 1500 learn-to-swim students, 600 swim team members, and other community

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	members that attend a variety of swim classes.
<b>Administration Center</b>	Offices and dedicated work spaces for staff and volunteers who are the heart of our mission to eliminate racism and empower women.

### Trailblazer: \$100,000-\$249,999

<b>Shelter Arrival Area</b>	This space will offer domestic violence survivors the dignity, privacy, and calm they deserve as they await the services they need to begin their healing.
<b>Small Swimming Pool</b>	For over 1000 of our youngest swimmers each year, the warm-water pool empowers children to swim and thrive in the water.
<b>Locker Room (2)</b> (\$100,000 each)	The entryway to aquatics, two locker rooms support all swimmers as they prepare for swim lessons, team practices, and lap swims.
<b>Family Meeting Area</b>	A safe space for shelter residents to meet with relatives to stay connected to their support network, allowing them to plan the next step in their healing journey. This especially helps children in the shelter feel less isolated from relatives and friends during this difficult time.
<b>Group Therapy Room (Reserved)</b>	A space for group counseling where survivors receive counseling and share their stories with other survivors to start the healing process.

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<b>Welcome Desk (Main Lobby)</b>	The entry point and first impression where members of our community are greeted and invited to participate in our mission, make deeper connections, and explore new opportunities for growth and support.
<b>Main Entrance Plaza</b>	A landscaped and visually-welcoming outside gateway at the south entrance where program participants and guests will enter our facilities.
<b>Crisis Line</b>	A professionally-staffed 24/7 emergency phone line to answer calls from domestic violence survivors and offer support, referrals and hope in times of crisis.
<b>Economic Advancement Classroom (3) (\$150,000 each)</b>	Technology-enhanced classrooms will enable Economic Advancement clients to learn budgeting and other financial wellness tools, practice job-readiness skills, seek employment, and find affordable housing.

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### Change Agent: \$50,000-\$99,999

<b>Meditation Gardens</b>	Landscaped meditation spaces that offer a haven for calm reflection and planting new seeds of hope.
<b>Studio Apartments (20)</b>	Private bedrooms for smaller families or single women where holistic, trauma-informed healing can unfold. (\$75,000 each)
<b>Culinary Gardens</b>	Raised-bed vegetable gardens where clients and volunteers plant and harvest fresh vegetables to foster healthy eating and inclusive community.
<b>Shelter Kitchenette</b>	With the Kitchenette, shelter residents can exercise autonomy in daily living and create a new sense of community.
<b>Staff Care and Renewal Room</b>	A quiet, comfortable space for staff renewal and self-care enabling staff to balance the work of caring for others with the necessity of caring for themselves.
<b>Counseling Room (5)</b>	Comfortable and confidential meeting space where survivors receive confidential assistance and guidance to address the trauma and abuse in their lives. (\$50,000 each)

### Champion: \$25,000-\$49,999

<b>Aquatics Family Changing Rooms (2)</b>	Private changing areas where families and individuals who desire more space and privacy can prepare for their time in the pool. (\$25,000 each)
<b>Shelter Laundry Room (2)</b>	Private laundry room on each floor of residential shelter. (\$25,000 each)
